CGUHSD Next Steps:


- This week school Principals will be reaching out to their school communities about the online instruction to come.

- CGUHSD teachers have been preparing to respond to an extended school closure with a remote and online based instructional plan that seeks to meet the needs of all students for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year.
- The District Leadership Team is meeting and conferencing virtually along with designated instructional staff to monitor our plan and to assist our teaching staff as we transition into this new learning environment.

As we shift into this new format of schooling, please continue referring to the CGUHSD website regularly for our current updates and information that is needed. We truly care about the students of the Casa Grande Union High School District community and we are doing everything in our power to ensure that they are taken care of during these challenging times.

During this time of school closure, we are aware that there are many concerns surrounding graduation for our seniors. While we might not have answers at this time, we do expect to have answers and information to be able to share with you shortly. This week the Arizona Department of Education Governing Board is meeting to be able to address these issues and to provide guidance for our schools and districts. We understand the significance of participating in a graduation ceremony for our seniors and their families. As soon as we have some guidance and direction from the state, we will pass it on to you.
