**Course Description:**

Structured English Immersion- Proficient language skills are a vital transition to higher academic skills; therefore, a rigorous academic environment is maintained within a safe and responsive classroom.

Students will develop reading strategies to help them improve their comprehension along with writing strategies they can apply in other classes. Students will share work and confer with the teacher to receive individualized feedback. Students will have frequent targeted instruction and small group instruction. Students will be expected to learn, grow, and perform to the best of their abilities in the four domains of reading, writing, listening, and speaking as outlined in the ELD State Standards. The goal is to pass the state AZELLA test at the end of this year with an overall proficient level.

**Required Materials:** Students will need to have the following supplies in class *each day*:

- Student laptop computer and ID, provided by the school
- Composition notebook, writing folder, lined paper, black or blue pen, and a pencil
- A school provided personal Email account for course work and communication
- Internet access at home (hot spots available or classrooms to work in)
- It is helpful to have access to a USB drive to save your work.

**Grading Policy:** Grades will be based on: student assignments, homework, assessments and evaluations, and class participation. For major assignments, models and rubrics will be provided. The class grading scale is:

**Assignment Breakdown and Weighting:** Quarter Grades are comprised of On Task Behaviors. Participation, Homework and Class Assignments 50% and Assessments 50%  
Semester Weighting: 40% Quarter 1, 40% Quarter 2, and Final Exam 20%

**ESS (Exceptional Student Services):** Students with an IEP or a 504 Plan will be accommodated with identified modifications given according to their determined needs.

**Powerschool:** Please familiarize yourselves with the computerized Student/Parent version of Powerschool. It allows both the parent and student to view the student's information, academic progress, and missing assignments. (Use Quick links at the bottom of the district website.)

**AZELLA Testing-** All ELD students will take the annual AZELLA State Test in Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking until they show overall proficiency. Students who show proficiency on AZELLA will be in general education classes the following semester.

**Attendance Policy:** Rule of 13- Students may fail the class for the semester in any course, when reaching a total of 13 excused/unexcused absences or tardies. Efforts will be made to notify parents at absence/tardy number 5 and a student will be put on academic probation at absence/tardy number 8.

Success in this class requires students to *be in class, on time, every day*. \*If a student must miss class, it is his or her responsibility to find out which assignments were missed, to acquire the handouts, and to borrow and copy the class notes.

- Plan for scheduled/anticipated absences by turning in or requesting assignments ahead of time.
- Excessive absences and/or tardies will result in a referral.

**Late Work/Make-Up/Tutoring:** Please anticipate scheduled absences by turning in work early or by obtaining the required materials before your departure. You will be able to make up tests and quizzes during the instructor's designated office hours (Th. 3-4). Students have two weeks maximum to make up missed work. Appointments can also be made to stay after school most days, with advance notice.

If a student will be absent for a significant period of time, a parent may call in for a homework request. It is the student's responsibility to obtain make-up work from the class officers. Long-term projects are due on the due date; no exceptions.

**National Board Teacher:** Mrs. DeVet is a Master (MA) level and National Board Professional Teacher and continues the practice to frequently videotape classes to improve instruction and student engagement. Videos are kept private and only shared with her mentor/coach/colleague. Videos will never be shared electronically or in a public manner. Students may be asked to watch themselves in a class video if it is helpful to them.

**Academic Expectations:**

- Maintain a minimum of a "D" grade; if you're failing, mandatory tutoring may be assigned.
- Be prepared by bringing supplies, being seated, and working *when the bell rings*.
- Be involved by participating in discussions, class work, and activities. Stay on task.
- Be respectful toward learning, other people, and the school materials and facilities.
- Keep track of assignments, deadlines, and homework. Turn in homework when completed.
- Test for comprehension on books read which you have taken notes on, to earn reading points.

**Plagiarism/Cheating:** Plagiarism is the deliberate reproduction of ideas, words, or statements of another person without proper acknowledgement of who did the work (copying). At the teacher's discretion, plagiarized work may earn a zero, be given a referral, and there will be no opportunity to repeat the work.

**Behavioral Expectations:** Students are expected to follow all district-wide policies concerning appropriate dress, use of electronics, and respectful behavior. **Any behavior that disrupts the learning/teaching process will not be tolerated.** Serious violations may result in disciplinary referrals to the Dean of Students. NO IMAGE OR AUDIO OR VIDEO Recording of Mrs. DeVet, other students, or events taking place in this class may be taken by students or shared without explicit permission. **NO EARBUDS** may be seen or used in class. Put them in your backpack or pocket. **Phones** are only to be used for educational purposes. Phone use privileges may be removed by the teacher at her discretion. Phones may be put in a sealed envelope and given to the student as a reminder or sent to the office for repeated disruption.

**Online Learning and Assignments-**

Students are expected to check their email, calendar, and Blackboard classes every day. TEAMS will also be used. Many online assignments will come through Blackboard or TEAMS, and personal or group communication may be sent through your school email.

TPRS- Total Physical Response Storytelling- This is a very engaging, new strategy for language learning that we will be using this year. Every student will be expected to fully participate. It may feel awkward at first, but this will greatly improve confidence, comprehension, ability to ask questions, speak with detailed language and correct grammar, and ability to speak on a subject and describe a situation.
