### **Introductory message: MODIFIED IN-PERSON**

The school year will begin August 17 with remote learning for all students. Remote learning will continue until it is safe to transition to modified in-person learning and ultimately in-person learning.

What can families expect while learning in a modified in-person environment? Students will alternate between in-person learning and structured, remote learning throughout the week. Students will be assigned to an "A" or "B" schedule based on their last names and will attend school on alternating days (ex: Mondays/Thursdays and every other Wednesday or Tuesdays/Fridays and every other Wednesday) to ensure fewer students are on campus to maximize physical distancing.

In the remote portion of the week, students will participate in learning through the Blackboard learning management system, using teacher-created curriculum.

Please note, elements of our plan may be subject to change based on new information and guidance from the Federal/State government and health agency partners. We will continue to share relevant updates with our community.

### **Modified In-Person**

- Grades 9-12
- Enrolled in CGUHSD school
- 5 days per week instruction
- Combination of in-person and remote learning
- Teacher-led instruction and asynchronous learning
- CGUHSD teachers and curriculum
- Students will be enrolled in both core subject and elective courses
- Full-time or half-time schedules (qualified seniors only) based on student academic graduation requirements.
- Accommodations and support services provided
- Social-emotional support
- Eligible to participate in athletics/activities/events following in-person eligibility guidelines and safety measures as determined by the CDC and Pinal County Health Department.
- District laptop provided
- Internet access required CGUHSD may provide limited support. Contact your child's school for more information.
- Breakfast/lunch available daily, following Federal nutrition guidelines.

### Detail of Modified In-Person

- **Attendance will be taken daily** in both the in-person and online formats.
- On days when students are on campus, the student will be marked present when they arrive at class daily and on time. On their remote learning days, students will be marked present when they log in for learning and complete the daily assignments.
- Although students must log on to each class period daily to be marked present, the emphasis will be on completing assignments and not on the time students spend online.
- On their in-person days, students will experience a typical school day with enhanced health and safety measures.
- When remote, students will use Blackboard to access CGUHSD teacher created core and elective courses.
- All courses offered during in-person learning will be available remotely.
- When remote, self-guided and live learning will occur with a focus on competency of standards and units of instruction.
- Teachers will provide ongoing feedback and district grading practices will be used.
- Teachers will provide office hours and live individual and/or small group sessions will be available.
- Training is available for students and parents on all learning platforms.
- Parents are encouraged to actively participate in their student's learning to assist school with ensuring student participation and completion of courses.
- Students will be able to participate in extracurricular activities such as band and high school athletics, following health and safety guidelines when available, as well as student eligibility.
- Field trips have been canceled for fall semester.
- Information on state testing will be shared with students and families after the start of the school year.

## CGUHSD Learning Models

---



The school year will begin August 17 with remote learning for all students. Remote learning will continue until it is safe to transition to modified in-person learning and ultimately in-person learning. Families who wish to continue in a remote learning model for the school year, may do so and will be enrolled in CGUHSD Online (CGUHSD virtual high school).

What can families expect while learning in CGUHSD Online?

Students will participate in the high-level learning they are used to, but in a structured online environment using Edgenuity. The Edgenuity curriculum is grounded in research and is aligned to Arizona State Standards, the Common Core, and the NGSS. Students will be enrolled in three courses per quarter, and are expected to complete six courses per semester, based on each student's academic graduation requirements. Families who choose to continue in this model are asked to remain remote for the duration of the school semester.

Please note, elements of our plan may be subject to change based on new information and guidance from the Federal/State government and health agency partners. We will continue to share relevant updates with our community.

### CGUHSD Online

- Grades 9-12
- Enrolled in CGUHSD Online
- 5 days per week remote learning instruction
- Edgenuity courses
  - Core subjects and electives (course offerings provided by school counselors)
- CGUHSD teachers using online Edgenuity Curriculum
- Students are enrolled in three courses per quarter and are expected to complete six courses per semester based on student academic graduation requirements.
- Accommodations and support services provided
- Social-emotional support
- Eligible to participate in athletics/activities/events on their home campus, following in-person eligibility guidelines and safety measures as determined by the CDC and Pinal County Health Department.
- District laptop provided
- **Reliable Internet access is mandatory; not provided by CGUHSD**
- Breakfast/lunch available following Federal nutrition guidelines
- Opportunity to transition to Modified In-Person Model only at semester break
- ~~Students and parents required to attend an online orientation meeting~~
- **Teachers will contact students regarding the first day of school and online protocols prior to the start of school**

**Details of Online Instruction:**

Should a family continue remote learning for an extended time, some courses may not be available due to lab and equipment resources and hands-on assessment requirements, such as CTE and Fine Arts classes.

- **Daily attendance** and completion of assignments in each course are vital components of successful online learning.
- In order for students to receive adequate attendance, they are expected to log on to Edgenuity and commit to a daily minimum of 4 1/2 hours, actively engaged in completing the assignments in their courses.
- Edgenuity tracks students *idle time* (logged on, but not working on assignments) and *actual time* (working on assignments) every day. The daily 4 ½ hour requirement is tracked using the *actual time* when a student is logged on and engaged in completing assignments.
- Self-guided and live learning will occur with a focus on competency of standards and units of instruction.
- Teachers will provide ongoing feedback and district grading practices will be used.
- Teachers will provide daily office hours, and live individual and/or small group sessions will be available.
- Edgenuity training is available for students and parents upon request.
- Parents are encouraged to actively participate in student learning to assist school with ensuring student participation and completion of courses.
- Students may participate in extracurricular activities such as clubs and high school athletics, following health and safety guidelines when available as well as student eligibility. **\*Band and choir are not available online at this time.**
- Information on state testing will be shared with students and families after the start of the school year.
