






Is this an alternative or credit recovery school?




What does personalized and mastery-based mean?

Students must demonstrate mastery of skills and competencies to move to the next level or learning portfolio.









Do you grade using traditional letters like A, B, C, D, F?

Our students are scored on their level of performance which ranges from a 2-12. The ultimate goal by the end of their high school experience is to be at a 10, which is college and career ready. These scores convert to traditional letter grades at the end of each semester. Our students can replace any failing grades in semester 1 with a better grade from semester 2.














Can students participate in sports and clubs?
