Options for College Credit

CAC Early College

- 6 College Credits tuition-free per semester (Fall, Spring, Summer)
- Maintain a 2.5 GPA or higher
- Be enrolled in 11th or 12th Grade
- Online and in-person courses available
- You must provide your own transportation, textbooks and any miscellaneous fees
- Credits are transferable for high school credit
- Please see your counselor for more information

Dual Enrollment

- High School courses that offer college credit
- Current offerings: College Algebra/Trigonometry, Calculus, Statistics, and College Composition I and II.
- Transferrable to In-State Universities

AP Courses

- Weighted Courses
- Must take and earn a certain score on the AP test
- Numerous offerings including AP Literature, AP Stats, AP Calc, AP Gov, AP Psychology, AP seminar, AP Spanish, and more.

- Every student must complete the course selection form to pick the classes for next school year
- Students will receive the form from their Spartan Time teacher on Jan 24th
- Juniors will meet with the counselor during their English class on Jan 27 - 31st
- You must get your parent signature
