- We are writing to inform you of some upcoming changes that will be taking place at our school.

What's Cookin Mr. Danzy?

Strawberry Pretzel Salad Ingredients:

Topping

2packages (4-serving size each) Jell-O® strawberry-flavored gelatin

- 2cups boiling water
- 2boxes (16 oz each) frozen sweetened strawberries, thawed

Crust

- 2cups pretzels, crushed
- 3/4cup butter, melted
- 3tablespoons sugar

Filling

- 1container (8 oz) Cool Whip frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1package (8 oz) cream cheese, softened
- 1cup sugar

Directions:

- Dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Stir in strawberries; refrigerate until partially set, about 1 hour 45 minutes
- Heat oven to 350° F. In medium bowl, mix Crust ingredients. Press into ungreased 13 x 9-inch baking dish. Bake 10 minutes. Cool on cooling rack.
- In medium bowl, beat Filling ingredients with electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Spread over cooled crust. Cover and refrigerate until cool and gelatin topping in bowl is partially
- · Carefully spoon gelatin topping over filling.
- Refrigerate 4 to 6 hours or until firm. To serve, cut into 4 rows by 3 rows.
