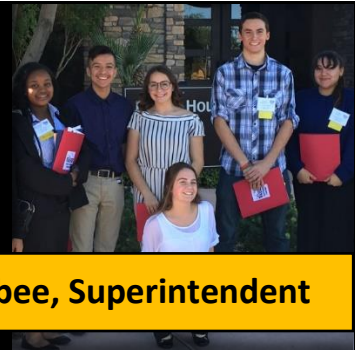

A note from the Superintendent...



Dear CGUHSD Parents, Community and Staff:

Over the past several months, we have continued to watch the Arizona Department of Health Services benchmarks to make decisions for the safety of our students and staff in order to safely return students back on campus. We are very excited to have students back once again in our modified in-person learning model. Currently, we are waiting for Pinal County benchmarks to fall into moderate transmission status so that all students who have chosen to learn in-person are able to come to school 5 days a week. For Pinal County to be considered in moderate transmission status, the number of cases in our county must be less than 50/100K and the percent positivity less than 5% over a seven-day period. The weekly benchmark data is released every Thursday morning by ADHS. We have already achieved the percent positivity benchmark and we are at 3.8% for the week of March 14, 2021. The number of cases also continues to drop daily, and we believe we are just weeks away from our students to return 5 days a week. Since we are very close to the moderate transmission goal, it is important that we start to plan and prepare for that return. When our benchmark does fall into the moderate transmission range, we will notify students, parents and staff of the exact date in which we will return to everyday instruction on our campuses.

Please continue to be safe and to do those things that are causing our cases to decline so that we can allow students to finish the school year the way it should be finished. Please stay tuned as we anticipate this change coming shortly.

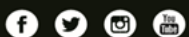

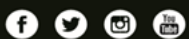
Rotary Students of the Month
