





Title VI Requirements

- An application is made annually- working on a 3 year program
- No carryover of funds permitted into the next year
- Grant period is July 1 to June 30 of each school year
- Grant focus is to assist in meeting the culturally related academic needs of Native American students.
- Title VI funds must supplement and not supplant other Federal,
 State or Local funding that are providing services to Native
 American students.

ESSER III- American Rescue Plan (federal)

- We received approximately \$6,901,274.77
- Funds will be used from July 1, 2021 through September 30, 2024
- Required to spend at least 20% to address <u>learning loss</u> due to COVID
 - Our minimum portion would be between \$1.2 to \$1.4 million
- All activities and interventions must be:
 - Evidence based
 - Address academic, social and emotional needs of students
 - Address the disproportionate impact of COVID on subgroup populations
 - -Major ethnic/racial groups
 - -Low-income students
 - -Children with disabilities
 - -English language learners
 - -Migrant students

 - -Youth in foster care






