

AP Exams

Due to safety concerns related to COVID-19, College Board released the following information regarding AP testing.

The highlights are:

- ⇒ AP Exams will be offered for students to take remotely. Exams can be taken at home and on any device to which a student has access— computer, tablet, or smartphone. Each exam will be 45 minutes in length.
- ⇒ Colleges support this solution and are committed to ensuring that AP students receive the credit they earn.
- ⇒ Additional testing information will be released on Friday, April 3rd.
- ⇒ Digital portfolio submission deadlines are extended to Tuesday, May 26, at 11:59 p.m. EST.
- ⇒ Any student can cancel the exam at no charge. Please email Ms. Beechum, jbeechum@cguhsd.org if you would like to cancel your exam.
- ⇒ Only units covered until early March are covered on the exam. The exam questions are designed to prevent cheating. College Board uses a range of digital security tools to protect the integrity of the exams.
- ⇒ Instructional resources launched on 3/25/20--free remote learning resources.
- ⇒ The online exam will be offered on two dates (TBD).
